Postsecondary and Career Expectations

Each student should have an individualized learning plan to help make decisions about career and post-secondary (PS) education or training, to plan a course of study, and to make financial aid assessments with family members.



By the end of 9th grade

- Attend a College Fair
- Identify 2-3 adults to support the student through the postsecondary and career selection process
- Know the Importance of community service and extracurricular activities to postsecondary and career plans
- Know the relationship between high school coursework, attendance, and grades to postsecondary plans
- Begin determining eligibility for advanced placement (AP) courses
- Review coursework, and postsecondary/career plans in relation to the ISBE CCRI
- Participate in an opportunity to develop public speaking skills
- Attend a career exploration day
- Be aware of youth employment opportunities while in high school
- Understand how taking the right courses in high school can reduce the cost of college
- Be exposed to a financial literacy unit in a course or workshop
- Learn about financial wellness

Career Exploration and Development Post-Secondary Education Exploration, Preparation, and Selection

By the end of 10th grade

- Attend a postsecondary options workshop
- *Complete a unit on education planning
- *Know the general timing of postsecondary entrance exams and applications
- Connect with a mentor
- Know relationship between community service/extracurricular activities and postsecondary/career goals
- Outline a plan for community service and extracurricular activities related to postsecondary plans
- *Complete a college fit/match inventory
- Complete a career cluster survey
- Complete an orientation to career clusters
- Complete one or more team-based challenges or projects related to the career pathways
- Participate in mock job interview
- Identify two related postsecondary paths and/or college majors strongly correlated with career cluster survey results
- Select a career pathway within a career cluster of nterest
- Know educational requirements, cost, expected entry level, and midpoint salary for occupations in selected career pathway
- Learn about employer expectations and employability skills
- Understand W-4s, pay stubs, and income taxes
- Understand the various aspects of personal banking
- Identify resources for paying for college
- Know how salary impacts standard of living
- Explore the opportunity costs of postsecondary choices

By the end of 11th grade

- *Know the different types of postsecondary credentials and institutions
- *Compare campus life opportunities
- *Visit at least 3 postsecondary institutions
- *Take at least one college entrance exam
- *Know 3-5 match schools, one safety, one reach school for postsecondary program of study
- Compare and contrast personal strengths and weaknesses with career choice
- Interview a professional who is working in a desired
- Participate in a job shadowing opportunity
- Create a resume and personal statement
- Know application deadlines, test timing, cost, and preparation for industry-based certification for career pathway
- Identify an internship opportunity related to career pathway
- Visit at least one workplace aligned with career interest
- Know how to find scholarship opportunities
- Complete a financial aid assessment with a family member
- Attend a postsecondary affordability workshop with a family member
- Know general cost ranges of various postsecondary institutions
- Understand timeline for financial aid process
- Know financial aid deadlines for chosen postsecondary options
- Know the affordability of postsecondary options in relation to expected entry-level career salary and anticipated debt
- Know the difference between need-based, merit-based, and self-help financial aid

By the end of 12th grade

- [®] By 12/31, Complete 3 or more admissions applications to postsecondary institutions
- *By 12/31, Meet with a school counselor to ensure all steps in the postsecondary admissions process are completed on time
- Understand the job application process for desired field(s)
- Obtain an internship opportunity related to the career pathways
- Create a plan to pay for college using financial resources
- Complete the FAFSA (or other financial aid application)
- Attend a financial aid application completion workshop
- Know the terms and conditions of the scholarship or loan
- Understand the student loan process and available oan options
- Understand how to be a responsible borrower
