




# **FAFSA Completion Initiative**

- Promotes FAFSA
   Completion by providing data on the number of FAFSAs completed by school
- Search and sort features allow users to easily find and compare data from Illinois high schools
  - Data updated on a weekly basis






# **FAFSA Completion By School**





## **GAP Access**

- What is it?
  - Provides participating high schools the ability to identify which of their students have completed the FAFSA or the Alternative Application each academic year
  - Data includes:
    - Student names
    - Eligibility for MAP Grant
    - Aggregate #s of how many students are eligible for the Monetary Award Program (MAP) and the federal Pell Grant Program; expected family contribution (EFC) ranges
    - listing of the first-choice colleges to which students sent their application results.
  - High school principals <u>sign up</u> for participation through the <u>GAP Access</u> portal of ISAC's website

# State Scholars Program

- Early announcements
  - Schools will have the option of participating in an early announcement cycle – announcements will be made on a regular schedule
- Congratulatory letters & certificates
  - Congratulatory letters will be sent out at the same time as the announcements
  - Schools will have the option of printing their own certificates
    - This option will allow schools to reprint certificates at any time
- Regular announcements
  - Schools that do not wish to participate will receive announcements as regularly scheduled (around November)



# College Changes Everything (CCE) Campaign

- The mission of the CCE campaign is to encourage students to complete college applications and a financial aid application.
- Schools and organizations can participate in the CCE campaign by:
  - Submit an Outreach Request Form and check they are interested to participate in CCE
  - Conduct one college application workshop and one Financial Aid Application Completion Workshop between Labor day and Thanksgiving





# ISAC Transcript Exchange

- ISAC Transcript Exchange
  - Through Parchment a digital credential service
  - Electronic exchange of transcript information for Illinois students
- No Cost
  - Service is free for high schools when transcripts are sent electronically to any participating college worldwide
    - Including schools on the NCAA and Common App

### Overview

The ISAC Transcript Exchange, through Parchment Exchange enables the electronic exchange of transcript information for Illinois students.

Launched in fall 2011, the service provides the opportunity for students to request that transcripts be sent electronically to the college(s) of their choice. To protect the privacy and confidentiality of transcript data, documents are sent through a secure transcript service in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).




- Financial literacy game that allows students to choose a career and navigate through different spending choices








# College Checklist



# Financial Aid Comparison Worksheet

PRINT BLANK WORKSHEET

- Worksheet that allows students to compare up to 3 award letters at a time
- Helps student calculate out-of-pocket costs
- Gives a better understanding of the components within award letters such as:
  - Cost of attendance
  - Gift aid
  - Federal work study
  - Student loan aid
  - Remaining need

### Caree

- □ Revisit the careers you are interested in and expand on your current career interests. Identify one or two new careers that you might want to explore.
- □ Explore career clusters by going to studentportal.isac.org/resources
   > Illinois WorkNet > Careers, Wages and Trends.
- Research the careers you are interested in to find out what the job responsibilities are for each career, and what kind of education and skills are needed.
- □ Consider talking to someone who works in those careers about their favorite and least favorite part of their job, as well as how much eduction is needed for their job.



### Money

- ☐ Talk to your parent(s)/guardian or your local ISACorps member about what financial resources are available to help you pay for college. You can use the FAFSA4Caster by going to studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/ estimate and clicking on FAFSA4Caster.
- Research how much it would cost to attend an:
- in-state 4-year public college/ university vs. in-state 4-year private college/university
- in-state 4-year public college/ university vs. out-of-state 4-year public college/university
- in-state 4-year private college/ university vs. out-of-state 4-year private college/university



### College

- Research what degree/certificate programs colleges offer.
- Make an appointment to meet with a counselor at your school to talk about what classes you need to take to prepare for college.
- ☐ Talk to your counselor about Advanced Placement (AP) classes: what the courses require as well as how and when you can take them.
- Identify different community service and extracurricular activities that could help you explore your career interests.
- ☐ Talk to your school counselor or teacher about how your school grades and attendance can affect your future plans for life after high school




